

Parts of Speech

Noun	Pronouns
<p>A noun is a person, place, or thing.</p> <p><i>Examples: teacher, school, book</i></p>	<p>A pronoun is a word that replaces a noun.</p> <p><i>Examples: I, he, she, it, we, you, they</i></p>
Verbs	Adverbs
<p>A verb is an action word. Verbs can be written lots of different ways depending on when the action happens.</p> <p><i>Examples: to jump, jumped, jumping</i></p>	<p>An adverb is a word that describes a verb. It describes how, when, where, and to what degree.</p> <p><i>Examples: quickly, always, happily</i></p>
Adjectives	Conjunctions
<p>An adjective describes a noun or pronoun.</p> <p><i>Examples: noisy, dark, beautiful, warm</i></p>	<p>A preposition is a word used to join groups of words or sentences together.</p> <p><i>Examples: because, although, until</i></p>
Prepositions	Interjections
<p>A preposition is a word that describes location or position of a noun or pronoun in comparison to something else.</p> <p><i>Examples: under, over, in, behind</i></p>	<p>An interjection is a short exclamation.</p> <p><i>Examples: Bam! Ouch! Yay!</i></p>
